This happy, loving boy was a trooper and peppered his neurologist with kisses during the exam and testing. He had signs of cranial trauma and neurological issues. He has now healed nicely from the trauma but continues to bob his head and walk a little off

kilter on occasion. No medication is required at this time; however, his condition will require future check-ups. Franklin has no pain and enjoys life to the fullest as all puppies should!
