This stunning Siamese mix with mesmerizing blue eyes has faced challenges - he's FIV+ and has an old eye injury that limits his vision in one eye. But despite it all, he's gentle, affectionate, and just looking for a patient, loving home.

What is FIV, and Why Shouldn't It Scare You?

Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) affects a cat's immune system, but many FIV+ cats live long, healthy lives with proper care. Here are some key facts:

- ✓ FIV IS NOT EASILY TRANSMITTED it spreads primarily through deep bite wounds, meaning FIV+ cats can often live with non-FIV cats peacefully.
- FIV+ CATS CAN LIVE JUST AS LONG AS NON-FIV CATS with good nutrition and regular vet care.
- FIV DOES NOT MEAN FREQUENT ILLNESS many FIV+ cats are just as healthy as any other cat!

Barry has been fully vetted, had a dental, and is ready to find a home where he can be loved for the incredible cat he is. He's a bit shy at first but warms up beautifully with patience and kindness. Could you be the one to give Barry the forever home he deserves?

I may not be perfect, but I am adorable and my name is John Snow!

After several days, my prayers were answered. A nice lady from the Las Vegas Valley Humane Society pulled me from the shelter and took me on a fun car ride. She took me to a loving foster home! No more cages or loud noises. I made myself at home on the sofa and enjoyed some yummy treats! My foster mom soon discovered walks are my favorite activity. You would never guess I'm a senior once that harness and leash get fastened! When I'm all tired out, snuggles and laying close to my person make me happiest. I also love cuddling up to my foster sister, Margo. My foster mom says I'm a really good boy and she calls me a sweetheart!

A Heartbreaking Rescue Story with a Happy Ending

Imagine being old, deaf, blind, confused, horribly underweight, and all alone on the streets. Not knowing where your next meal will come from or if you will survive to see another day.

Your only salvation is a disabled elderly woman who tries to care for you by leaving food outside hoping you'll find it. You have to blindly cross busy streets, stay away from coyotes, wild dogs, and wicked people. The caretaker keeps a watchful eye out everyday and worries when you wander because it's not a matter of if, but when you will fall in harm's way. Don't forget you're blind, can't hear the cars or dogs barking. She often grabs her broom, runs out into the street to gently nudge you up on the sidewalk.

The loving caregiver names you "Slim Jim" and you are one of the hundreds of thousands of street cats in the Las Vegas valley. After weeks of worrying, your guardian angel calls LVVHS for help. Upon hearing this heartbreaking story, our wonderful volunteers immediately came up with a rescue plan. We have to find Slim Jim a safe place. A dedicated volunteer trapper contacts the caregiver only to be informed Slim Jim has disappeared. She hasn't seen him in 3 days. In the meantime, we hear about a Good Samaritan that spotted a blind cat walking in circles by a dumpster. She knew something wasn't right so she took him to a rescue she knows. Through the grapevine, we hear about it and call for a picture. Yes, it's Slim Jim! The other rescue has agreed to care, house and feed HER. Turns out he is a she and renamed "EDEN." Her recovery is remarkable. She's friendly, has gained weight and loves to cuddle when she's not sleeping in her princess bed.

This true story has a happy ending. Unfortunately, however, 95% of street cats live a miserable, hungry and scary life. Please just remember - it's not their fault.
